In Southern Peru at the headwaters of the Amazon is the Tambopata Research Station where scientists from all over the world carry out their studies. As part of their room and board, these experts are obligated to show visitors around. Long-time Orange Audubon member naturalist Bill Partington took advantage of this opportunity and will share with us the experience. He will also show slides of other places like Trinidad's Asa Wright Lodge, a volcano in Ecuador, the Sea of Cortez (between Baja California and California), and will share his experience staying with an Indian family in the Amazon. And for those of us who don't have the opportunity to travel, Bill will show us some interesting spiders, ants, wasps, and other small creatures we are likely to see in our local parks and backyards. ## October Field Trip - Rock Springs Run State Reserve

On Saturday, October 22nd, OAS will visit Rock Springs Run State Reserve near Sorrento. This property, on the west side of the Wekiva River, provides important habitat for the threatened Florida Black Bear. With an emphasis on butterflies, we will hike three to four miles through oak hammock and sandhill communities.

McDonalds just north of SR 46 and just east of I-4. There is a small admission fee at RSRSR. Bring drink, lunch, sun protection, and insect protection. Our "Bobs" (Wheeler and Sanders) along with Dick Smith helped us find 38 species in only three hours of hiking. Though the heat did chase us back to an early picnic, we had fun getting to know eight newcomers and some old friends on a beautiful day. Highlights included Limpkin wails, both Red and

White-eyed Vireos, Wood Pewee, Acadian Flycatcher, Eastern Kingbird, and Wild Turkey. Barn and Tree Swallows also gave us an aerial show after two Black-Bellied Whistling Ducks did an early morning "fly-by". Thanks to all of you that came, as well as to many of you that were "working" elsewhere on the annual Migratory Bird Count. Thank you also to our new friends that came and joined us on this trip. ## Announcing OAS' 2006 Chertok Nature Photo Contest Going Digital with a New Theme and Prizes Galore

Orange Audubon Society (OAS) is pleased to announce the theme for its 2006 (18th Annual) Kit & Sidney Chertok Nature Photography Contest, "Florida – Wild & Wonderful!" In keeping with the objectives of promoting interest and concern for preserving Florida's native fauna and flora and encouraging nature photography, the contest rules require that subject matter be native to Florida and contain no significant trace of humans or human-made objects or artifacts.

Good news for state-of-the-art shutterbugs — the 2006 contest will be a digital competition open to all ages. Images in other formats such as slides or photographs may be converted to digital format before submission. Details regarding image specifications and submission will be delineated on the application form.

Deadline for entries is May 18, 2006 (postmark date) or you may hand deliver them to Teresa Williams at OAS' meeting at Leu Gardens that evening. Enter up to 4 images at \$3 each for Audubon members or \$5 each for nonmembers. Contestants who join OAS when submitting a contest entry form (membership application on back) are considered members.

Audubon organizations, while focusing on birds, are concerned with conservation and education regarding all wildlife and wild environments. Therefore, OAS seeks to foster your interest in all of Florida's wildlife and natural areas, not just birds. We encourage entries depicting any of Florida's native animals and plants, natural landscapes, seascapes and the like.

All winners will receive ribbons and recognition in OAS published articles. In addition to OAS's cash prizes of \$200, \$100 and \$50, respectively, Colonial Photo & Hobby (CPH), Orlando, will contribute three in-store gift cards with values of \$100, \$50 and \$25, respectively, for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners. All winning entries also vie for placement on the cover of OAS' next annual brochure and the opportunity to be featured in a store display(s) at CPH.


