This Month's Program: April 21st @ 7:00 p.m. Beautiful & Interesting Snakes: 38 Years of Snake Farming

For the past 38 years, George VanHorn has owned and operated Reptile World Serpentarium east of St. Cloud and has supplied venom for antivenin and medical research. The Serpentarium houses over 50 species of snakes from around the world, ranging from the familiar and innocuous to the exotic and deadly. There are also turtles, a large alligator, and other reptiles on display. Visitors have a chance to watch George VanHorn "milk" several highly dangerous snake species for venom. It was he and his family who brought the endangered Indigo Snake last year to support our speaker on the Orianne Project. We are very fortunate to have George back to tell about his experiences and about the fascinating snakes he has loved since childhood. He has promised to bring a snake or two, so bring your kids or grandkids and join us April 21st for a fascinating program.

April is the official annual meeting of members of Orange Audubon Society (OAS). This year's election will be held just prior to the evening program at Leu Gardens in Orlando on Thursday, April 21st. Orange Audubon Society's BIRDATHON — Saturday, April 17, 2011

On Apr. 17th Orange Audubon Society (OAS) will conduct its annual Birdathon fundraiser with members traversing the state to see the greatest number of species of birds in a single 24-hr period. Teams can go anywhere across Florida (i.e. various habitats) to try to see as many different species as possible. Last year OAS' total number of species was 148, far below our goal of 200 because the day was cold and miserable to be out in (my dentist's wife had snow at her place!). Our goal this year, as it was last year, is 200 species, so our teams have their work cut out for them. Birdathon co-chair, Gallus Quigley, has challenged any team to see more species than he does. He says they won't; however, he has promised to 'each member of the team that sees the most species' a window sticker proclaiming "Caution Birder On-Board". If you want to form a team, contact Gallus [407-376-4930; gallusq@cfl.rr.com] for details.

For this annual fundraiser we ask our members to go outside of our membership to find friends, relatives, co-workers, dentists, doctors, veterinarians, etc. (you get the picture) to pledge support for our "thon" just as you pledge to others for 'walkathons', 'bikeathons', 'danceathons', school class projects, Girl or Boy Scout money raisers, etc. Gallus has promised that the person collecting the most contributions (\$) in support of this year's birdathon will also receive one of the above-mentioned window clings. So, I challenge you to beat me for that window cling!! I've already procured a flat-amount contribution of \$20, another pledge of 10¢ per species and will be heading off to see my vet for his annual support; I'll also ask my co-workers and relatives. A pledge of 10¢ per species (multiplied by 200 species if Gallus can do it!) would be a pledge of \$20. If only 1,500 of our members procured pledges from two or three people, just think of the benefit that would bring to OAS' coffers AND all that money stays with OAS to use for educational and conservation programs! Furthermore, the pledges need not be for \$20, some people may give \$2 while others give \$50. When you ask for support, ask for only what the person feels they can offer. Every penny helps.

Genius Drive Nature Preserve Field Trip

Reservations are required for a guided field trip through the 48± acre **Genius Drive Nature Preserve in Winter Park on Sunday, April 17th, 8 a.m. to Noon**. Surveyors have documented 160 bird species on the Preserve. This walking field trip (FT) will be concurrent with Orange Audubon Society's (OAS) Birdathon Fund Raiser and bird survey led by survey leader and preeminent birder, Bruce Anderson. Expect fun fund raising citizen science in one venue!

The Preserve is also rich in 19th century history. The citrus groves and meandering Genius Drive with its hedges of shell ginger and Turk's cap were planted and constructed by Charles Hosmer Morse, the museum's namesake. The original Wind Song estate built in 1936 by Elizabeth Morse Genius still looks across Lake Virginia to Rollins College. A slice of romantic Old Florida has survived, as have Wind Song's infamous Peacocks.

Recently, OAS 'workday' volunteers assisted in planting a wildflower meadow of native wild flowers and grasses that add to the Preserve's plant diversity, thus enhancing its value for birds and other wildlife.

Youth, Amateur & Advanced Photo Contest Update

Orange Audubon Society's (OAS) Chertok Nature Photography Contest (CNPC) has two primary objectives: promoting interest and concern for preserving Florida's native species and encouraging nature photography. With the latter goal in mind, in 2010 OAS re-instituted a separate YOUTH competition for photographers age 17 or younger; and this year, after years of discussion OAS is separating the OPEN competition into categories by photographer level rather than by subject matter hoping to further encourage nature photography.

The OPEN competition categories are: AMATEUR, for beginners and inexperienced photographers, and ADVANCED, for experienced nature photographers who wish to compete (more fiercely?) with their peers.

The 2011 YOUTH theme is *Natural Florida* and the OPEN (all ages may compete in this competition) AMATEUR/ADVANCED theme *is Nature's Patterns*. This is a <u>Florida native nature</u> competition that tests your photographic skills and knowledge of Florida's native species. Subject matter cannot contain discernable non-native (to Florida) animals or plants nor traces of humans or human artifacts.

To enhance your knowledge of Florida's native species and as a courtesy to our valued participants, the CNPC screening

committee will provide FREE early screening and a chance for a FREE do-over of any disqualified image if your entries are received by the OPTIONAL early entry deadline of April 21, 2011. The FINAL DEADLINE is May 19, 2011 (received-by date).
