PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we head into our "summer break", I would like to take a moment to thank all of you for being a member of the Orange Audubon Society. As an all-volunteer organization, we rely upon the generosity of our membership for more than just monetary support. Your OAS Board of Directors work very hard to provide this organization with goals and leadership, volunteering countless hours of their time in an effort to make OAS a voice of conservation in Central Florida.

An organization is only as strong as its membership, and OAS needs your support in continuing its mission to provide the public an understanding of, and an interest in, our wildlife and the environment that supports it. We need your input as to programs that YOU wish to learn more about. Do you have a situation that may require the services of Audubon? Let us know! If you have the time, please consider volunteering, whether it is participating in one of our committees, leading a field trip, attending a function or event representing OAS, teaching a class or participating in workdays or surveys... WE NEED YOU!

As many of you are aware, this has been an especially worrisome time for Florida conservation, with our legislature showing an almost complete disregard for the critical environmental issues that affect our great state. This year, Florida lawmakers repealed almost 30 years worth of growth management legislation, including requirements that developers pay for roads, schools and other infrastructure needed to support their projects, as well as putting control into the hands of local officials thus ending state review of most large developments. Developers no longer have to prove their projects will not harm the environment; instead, this "burden of proof" has now shifted to require that a person or organization challenging a developer's permit prove it would cause sufficient damage to the environment to get the development stopped.

Now is the time that we must all band together to let our voices and concerns for our environment be heard. Don't let our wildlife and natural resources become an inconvenience in the pursuit of "monetary riches", join us in helping to foster the recognition of the intangible values in the remaining natural areas of Florida and the responsible conservation of our natural resources. With YOUR help, WE can make a difference!

May Field Trip Report

Ten birders attended the OAS May 21st field trip to Seminole Ranch Conservation Area in Christmas. At least 34 bird species were observed including Swallow-tailed Kite, Red-shouldered Hawk, Barred Owl, Red-eyed Vireo, White-eyed Vireo, Tufted Titmouse, Carolina Wren and Eastern Meadowlark. We made our return trip through Orlando Wetlands Park, seeing a variety of long-legged waders at Lake Searcy and then an adorable fledgling Northern Parula on the ground along the hiking trail. Other vertebrates included Sailfin Molly, Green Anole, Raccoon and White-tailed Deer.

Dragonflies (11 species) included Prince Baskettail, Slaty Skimmer, Black Saddlebags, Needham's Skimmer and Halloween Pennant. Butterflies (5 species) included Black Swallowtail, Great Southern White, and Twin-spot Skipper. Other invertbrates included Orchard Orbweaver, Golden Silk Orbweaver, and a praying mantid. Flowers in bloom included Starrush Whitetop (aka White Bracted Sedge), Yellow Canna, Pickerelweed, Water Hemlock, Ticktrefoil (aka Beggars' Lice), Wild Petunia, Buttonbush, Rosegentian (aka Marsh Pink), Turkey Tangle Fogfruit, Brown's Savory, and Fewflower Milkweed.

One unusual find was a small pair of binoculars high in a Live Oak. Thanks to all who attended for a fun day out in nature.

Governor and Legislators Curtail and Redirect "Growth Management"

With the changes made by our Legislators and Governor this past legislative session, Florida's Growth Management has been curtailed dramatically. To cite a few changes—need, financial feasibility and energy efficiency have been eliminated and school concurrency is now *optional*. In addition, more management/mismanagement decisions will now be taking place at the local level with little chance for stopping these decisions at the state level. Therefore, we all need to become acquainted with our local city and county officials and their staff members so that we can get involved in any proposed developments or changes to local Comprehensive Plans early on in the process. Please stay alert and bring any such proposals to the attention of your local conservation organizations—including Orange Audubon Society.
